Drug Duplication

Am I taking 2 drugs that do the same thing?

Drug Duplication suggests that at least one ingredient of a drug listed acts the same or very similarly to the ingredient of another drug listed. Taking both drugs could cause enhanced effects or be harmful.

Drugs found to be duplicated:

Claritin (Loratadine) 10 mg Tablet, Dispersible Lingual

Claritin (Loratadine) 10 mg Tablet

IBU-Profen (Ibuprofen) 200 mg Tablet

Advil (Ibuprofen) 100 mg Tablet
